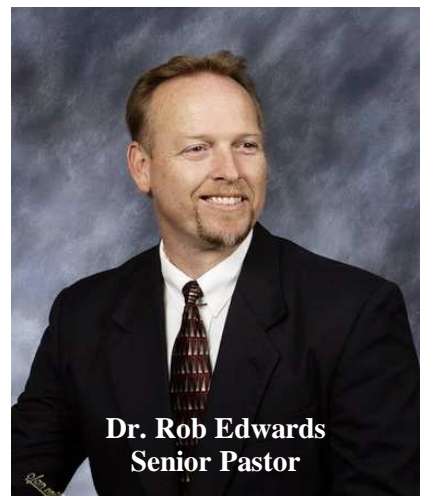

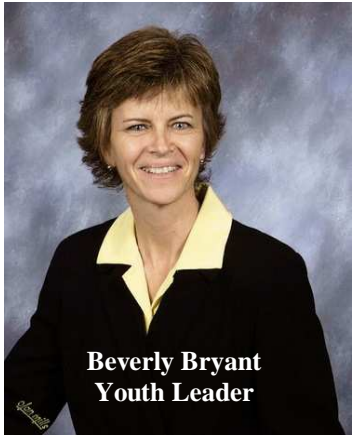

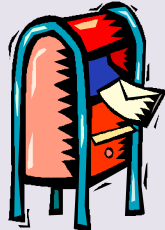

While this is first, and foremost, the Christmas season, we are aware that it is also the time of year when many of you are making your financial plans for the coming year. It has come to our attention that many of you may not be aware that we are facing a continuing shortfall in our ministry support levels. To that end, we decided to be as specific as possible so that you may be made aware of our current circumstances. Of course, financial support is just not possible for many of you. However, please know that we are thankful that you are praying for us, and thankful for the friendships that we have formed and deepened since becoming a part of this great ministry. No financial support is a important to us as the prayers of God's people. Prayer is our greatest resource.

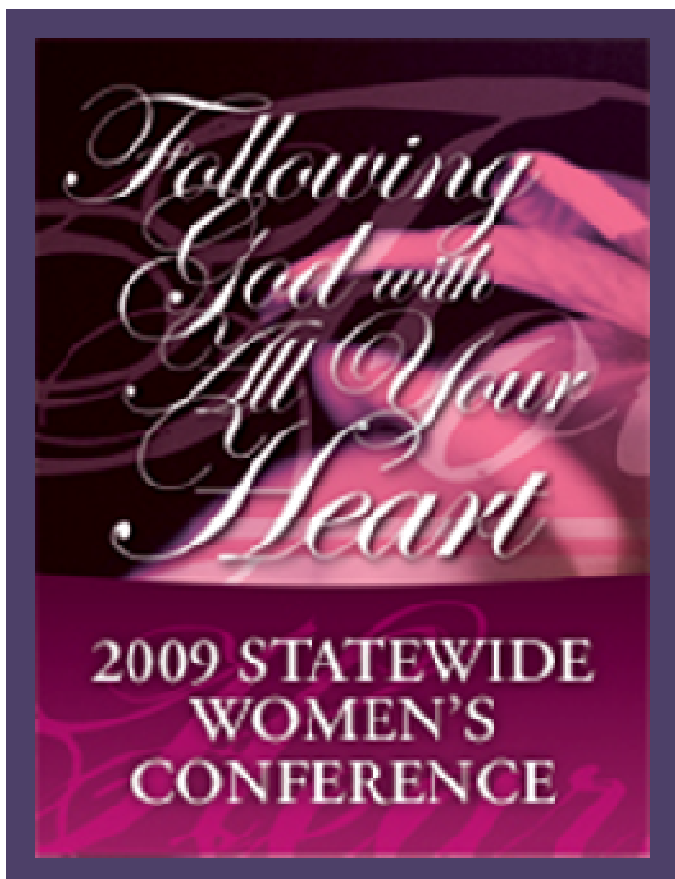
This is our current situation. We are currently seeing our support levels decline on an annual basis. Our support level was revised by the Mission Board in December 2006. At this time, we are at a current rate of 82% of our designated support level. This leaves us with a average monthly shortfall of \$700 for the year ending December 2008. While this amount has grown steadily over the past few months, Joyce has battled with rheumatoid arthritis on a daily basis. With the use of many nutritional supplements, she is not disabled, but enabled to do ministry.

Due to our diminishing paycheck, the costs of these supplements and other important purchases are becoming prohibitive, and tough choices are being made.

For some time we have hesitated to bring this to your attention in such specific terms because we know that these are difficult time for many of you. We only do so now because we know that this ministry is founded upon the principle of transparency, and the Lord expects nothing less from us.

Missions Ministry

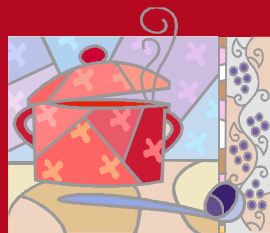

AFRICA MISSIONARIES, JASON, BEKAH, RIGHTEOUS & NEVAEH WITT

NEWS FROM THE WITZ

Just living in Garissa, there are many things we do that we do not plan at all. One example is when Jason got called late at night because our mechanic's wife was going into labor and needed him to drive her to the hospital. They were so

grateful to him they said they named their new son after him, JOHNSON! (For some reason it is very difficult for Kenyans to pronounce Jason's name so they usually call him Johnson or Jackson.)

We do have one responsibility that I always forget to mention. Jason and I are supervisors of Bethany Interns which is the college program in which we participated in 2004. Our internship was what drew us to Garissa. It had such a huge impact on our lives and hearts and we knew we would one day come back and make it our home. Last year we had eight Bethany students come—four boys and four girls. It has been wonderful to mentor them and see them grow into people (I am afraid to say it) that their parents will no longer recognize when they return to America this coming April. These eight have the most opposite personalities that I have ever seen. Let me just give an example of the four guys. Eric was enrolled in a university and majoring in engineering where he was planning on building robots for the rest of his life when God called him to be a missionary. Jamie was in culinary school planning on being a chef. Brice lives in the city in Minnesota where Little House on the Prairie takes place and was a farm boy his whole life. And last, but not least, Billy is an island boy born in Micronesia. Living here in Garissa, I miss my family so much. I, especially, miss my family not getting to be a part of our daughters' lives. These Bethany students could never take the place of aunts and uncles for Righteous and Nevaeh but I am blessed to have them as substitutes. Two days ago eight more Bethany students arrived in Kenya to live with us in Garissa for the next 16 months. We are now having orientation, making them go on the Amazing Race, and doing some tourist stuff. But they will officially start Swahili lessons in one week.



Many days I am having to stay in the home while Jason gets to go out into the villages and help out with different projects to show people God's love. Often times this makes me envious and has caused me to call him during the day asking if he could come pick me up with one of the kids so we could get out of the house. We have made a deal that I can go with him once a week. This most recent time I got to see the progress on Daudi's home we are building. Daudi is a muslim man that we met two months ago when his mom died of malaria. Since then his wife who was living in Somalia with their children got shot so all the kids will now come here to live. Daudi didn't have a place to live with his children so we really felt we need to pull our resources with the Bethany students and help him. We hire malochote men each day and provide food for them which they are so grateful for. Often times a huge crowd comes to circle and watches us and I am guessing it is not something they see everyday way out in the bush.

TEAMKIDS

We are excited! We have learned all the books of the New Testament as well as studying the meaning of the Ten Commandments. Ask us what they mean. The month of February is jam-packed with activities. Mrs. Onycha is challenging the kids with Bible study that applies to their daily life. The TEAMKIDS store is scheduled for February 4. Our monthly visit to the Consulate Nursing Home is February 25. Our kids are awesome examples of missionaries as they sing to the residents and visit each room. They make crafts to take and share. We have so much to be proud of with these kids.

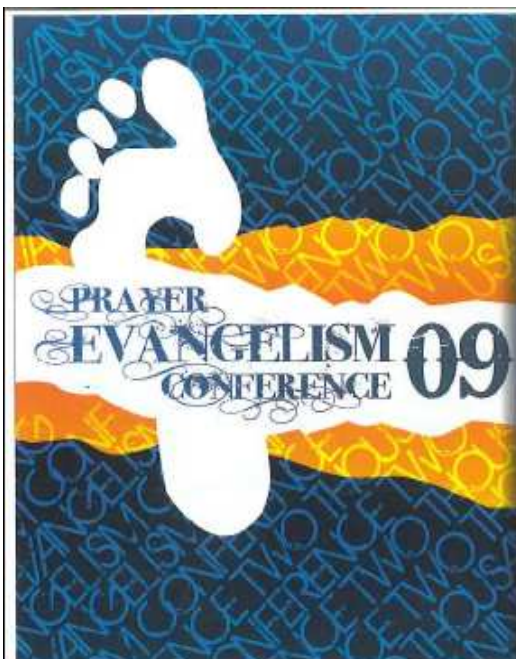

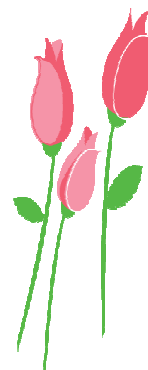
